AAUW Florida State Mini Grants —The AAUW Lake/Sumter Board is reviewing the guidelines to determine if we are able meet the eligibility and criteria to submit an application for a Mini Grant. More detailed information on Mini Grants is posted on our Web Site: http://lakesumter-fl.aauw.net

- Purpose: Mini grants will provide applicants with funds in the amount of \$100 to \$500 to support the Action Priorities of Florida AAUW; advance the Florida AAUW mission; develop the programmatic elements of the Florida Strategic Plan; and/or provide opportunities for women and girls to achieve their full potential.
- Eligibility: Any Florida AAUW Branch or inter branch may submit a proposal that has direct community impact and follows the stated purposes mentioned above. However, no branch or inter branch may receive a grant in two consecutive years for the same project.
- Criteria for Selection: (1) Clear and specific objectives;
 (2) Creativity of solution to problem or concern;
 (3) Evidence of careful planning, feasible plan of action, realistic time frame, and clear evaluation process;
 (4) Validity of budget proposal; and
 (5) Clarity of written proposal.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE; TECH TREK/STEM

The proverbial ball has started to roll for the 2016 Tech Trek camp in June sponsored by the Palm Beach State College on the FAU campus in Boca Raton.

The letters have been mailed to the Principals of six Lake and Sumter Middle Schools and our Committee now consists of twelve wonderful volunteers to conduct all the work that will follow.

The next step is to contact the STEM teachers in these schools and ask that they nominate the two most advanced students among their classes. An application will then be sent to these students to apply for the camp. We will then set up personal appointments to interview all these applicants after which we will choose those six that we feel will benefit the most from the camp experience. These choices will then be sent to the Florida 2016 Tech Trek State Directors who will make the final decisions. There will be 44 attendees chosen out of all the state-wide applicants.

As you can see, this is a long and tedious process but very rewarding when our local students are chosen to attend the camp.

In the Spring, The STEM awards will be given to those eighth grade girls who have shown the most improvement in their STEM classes. There will be more on this early next year.

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDRAISERS; VPK PROGRAM

Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten Project

Lake / Sumter AAUW branch in conjunction with the Tri-County League of Women Voters has undertaken a project to examine and summarize early childhood learning experiences in Florida, specifically the voluntary pre-kindergarten (VPK) programs in Lake, Marion, and Sumter Counties. Mandated by Florida voters as a state constitutional amendment in 2002, VPK guarantees free pre-kindergarten early learning programming for all 4-year-old children in the state.

The project included design of a questionnaire which was then sent to the Early Learning Coalitions (ELCs) in the tri-county area. Follow-up interviews have been held with staff in all three ELCs, and observational visits are planned in local VPK programs. Results are being compiled into a report that will be presented to the League of Women Voters at their January 25, 2016, meeting. All Lake / Sumter AAUW branch members are invited to attend the meeting to learn the results of this project. Directors of the ELCs in the tri-county area will be at the meeting, and details of time and location will be provided as we get closer to the meeting date.

For more information about this project, or to get involved with it, contact Susan Gold, who initiated the study, or Linda Carpenter. Both of these Lake/Sumter AAUW branch members have been involved in the project from its inception and will be happy to provide you a current status.
